

Boris IAROCHEVITCH



Belgian, born in Brussels in 1958.

Completed a Master in Engineering (Ingénieur agronome) in 1984 at the Faculté des Sciences Agronomiques de l'Etat, Gembloux, Belgium, and a MBA in International Business Management in 1997 at the Academy of National Economy in Moscow. Holds a Diploma in Islamic Studies (University of Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina) and a Certificate in International Relations and Conflict Analysis (Université catholique de Louvain, Belgium) and is completing a Certificate in Geopolitical Analysis of Great Powers at the same university.

Between 1985 and 1991, worked on development projects in Senegal.

In 1992, dealt with the analysis of the distribution chains and of the price structure for basic foodstuffs delivered under the EC Food Aid Programmes to the former USSR.

Joined then the European Commission and worked in 1993 - 1998 and 2002 - 2007 in the EC Delegation to Russia, in charge of cooperation programmes in a number of sectors.

Between 1998 and 2001, worked in Brussels in the EC External Relations Directorate-General Unit dealing with Russia, Ukraine, Moldova and Belarus.

In 2007 - 2008, dealt with multi-country programmes for Asia and Central Asia in the EuropeAid Cooperation Office in Brussels.

Between October 2008 and June 2011, Head of Cooperation (and in 2010-2011 acting Head of Delegation) at the EU Delegation to Bosnia and Herzegovina.

From 15 June 2011 and 31 August 2015, Deputy Head of the EU Delegation to Georgia, in charge particularly of political issues and the conflicts.

As of 1 September 2015, Head of Division at the European External Action Service, dealing with the Eastern Partnership (multilateral track), Regional cooperation and the OSCE.
